In 2016, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at our institution passed a resolution to establish an Academic Audit Committee with a two-year tenure, comprising a chairman and two other members. The primary objective was to conduct an annual audit of the institute, thereby facilitating the development of a comprehensive academic quality management framework. The formation of this committee was officially approved during a university-level IQAC meeting.

The Academic Audit serves as a mechanism to gather evidence-based information pertaining to the quality of our academic programs. It fosters a culture of continuous evaluation and quality enhancement, underpinned by the sustained adoption of best practices across various academic programs. The Academic and Administrative Audit Committee (AA) oversees the assessment of ongoing improvements in both undergraduate and postgraduate curricula, teaching methodologies, and learning processes to ensure high-quality education. At Srinivas University, our approach to academic evaluation aims to enhance educational quality through self-reflection and self-improvement based on annual performance appraisals, student and stakeholder feedback, and ongoing assessment of teaching and learning processes. The Academic Audit is a valuable tool for the annual refinement of our syllabi by identifying strengths and areas in need of improvement.

Under the aegis of Srinivas University, the Academic and Administrative Audit Committee (AA) systematically evaluates each institution within the university, with its main objectives being:

- Facilitating a faculty-driven, continuous improvement process.
- Fostering dialogue among faculty, students, and administrators.
- Encouraging self-assessment based on quality principles.
- Promoting integration across various academic programs and disciplines.

Recognizing the necessity to adapt higher education to the demands of the contemporary world, including industry and civil society, it is imperative to explore new teaching and learning methodologies.

To achieve these objectives, the Academic Audit Team is responsible for identifying and finalizing a Convener and two members, either from the submitted panel or external sources. These identified individuals are then contacted through various means, such as phone, email, or letter, and are provided with academic handbooks, syllabi, and previous question papers in advance. The visits by the academic audit members were scheduled for April 2023.

On the day of the visit, the audit team is accompanied by core group members of the IQAC, including Prof. A. R. Shabaraya (Director and Chairman of the AAA committee), Dr. Hariprakash (Member), and Dr. Laveena Dmell (IQAC Coordinator), alongside the Deans of the respective Institutes and Heads of Departments.

During their visit, the team engages with teaching staff, non-teaching staff, and students from each department. The resulting report will encompass the following components:

- Strengths of the department.
- Best practices or distinctive features.
- Areas that require immediate attention.

The Academic Audit places strict adherence to the following parameters and components:

- Curriculum.
- Learning methods.
- Evaluation processes.
- Future development plans.

#### I Curriculum

## **Strength:**

- 1. The institution offers B. Ed. Degree programme, under Srinivas University which empowers future teachers with knowledge, skill and social awareness.
- 2. The institution is led by accomplished researcher, academician and competent faculty members who are maintaining consistent growth academically and in their performance with outstanding leadership ability and dynamism has made the institution reputed in terms of its functioning and academic results.
- 3. In addition to the class room based learning, pedagogy incorporates the first hand learning through field trips, practice teaching, surveys and technology based learning.

#### Weakness:

- 1) Due to their busy academic schedule the non-cooperation from the affiliated schools hinders the practice teaching sessions of the students.
- 2) Weak socio economic condition of the students: Institution being unaided, for the further expansion and improvement could not be considered since the budget required for cannot be expected due to the students weak socio economic condition.

## **Specific Areas for Improvement:**

- 1. Innovations and best practices: As laid down in the objectives, the institution endeavors to make available resources create centre of excellence, empowered, efficiently skilled and trained teachers to be in the teaching fraternity. Faculty members are upgrading their qualification and experience along with the progress of the students. Use of technology and Multi Media is encouraged.
- 2. Synergy: Resource sharing between the departments is practiced through access to departmental libraries, common pool of computers and faculty.
- 3. Better inter institutional collaboration: Collaboration with institutions like Pilicula Science Centre, St. Ann college of Education, CTE, DIET etc has contributed to improve the standard of institution in all the respects.

#### **Recommendations:**

- 1) Change in the duration of the course: As per NCTE norms, four year integrated course on cards and we need to start afresh degree programme under Srinivas University, which may discourage many aspirants to join the course which would affect admissions two year degree programme.
- 2) Strength of the Institution: Since we have two units of 50+50 strength and as demand has come down for two year degree, which would affect the collection of sufficient fees and in turn overall development of the institution.
- 3) Integrated course in the degree colleges: Our institution being purely college of Education, if the course gets integrated within the degree colleges the independent colleges like ours may have to suffer.

#### **II** Syllabus Strength:

- 1. Syllabus strictly structured according to NCTE (National Council of Teacher Education New Delhi. provides an instrument for effective learning and teaching strategies.
- 2. Syllabus initiates discussions concerning curriculum integration within and across different subjects every year.

- 2. Syllabus should provide equal importance to co-curricular & physical education activities in all the semesters equally
- **3.** The more number of standardized reference books should be implemented.

- 1. Upgradation of the syllabus every year
- 2. Incorporating new courses & technology
- 3. Taking opinion of external members & experts
- **4.** Providing attributes to budding teacher to face the future global challenges
