Subject: Scribe/Reader for Physically Disabled/Blind/Hearing Impaired Candidates during Examination

Guidelines for Scribe/Reader.

- 1. The Physically disabled/blind/Hearing Impaired student may select the scribe/reader.
- 2. The scribe/reader need not have a lower qualification than the student, provided that the scribe should not have the same qualification (with the same optional subject and languages) of the examinations, which the student is writing (for example a student who has completed BA or MA can be a scribe for the student who is taking BSc examinations).
- 3. If a physically disabled/blind/hearing-impaired candidates and the scribes for such candidates shall be allowed an extra time of 20 minutes per hour.
- 4. As the hearing-impaired students are having a language problem, possibilities of Grammar mistakes, mistakes in building the sentences are there. Hence, the answer papers of such candidates shall be snickered with a sticker; such answer papers shall be evaluated with additional care.
- 5. Scribes/readers are instructed not to offer textual interpretations or alterations of content. They are passive participants in the reading/writing process.
- 6. The reader or scribe is not to comment on the test or give any form of input. However, in the case of blindness or visual disability, it may be necessary for the reader to offer an explanation of the layout or appearance of a page. This is necessary if the layout of the test item involves visual elements such as pictures, graphs or complex tabular information.





Software for the Visually Impaired Students

Central Library of Srinivas University has the Brailleblaster Software and Duxbury Braille Translator for Visually Impaired students.

Brailleblaster is free and open-source text to Braille Converter Software for Windows whereas The Duxbury Braille Translator is another text-to-braille converter software for Windows. It is actually a paid software, but it provides a demo version that is completely free but with the limitation where one cannot save the converted file, but can print it. There is no time limitation on the demo version also hence it could be well utilized at the best interest of the Divyangjan.

- Brailleblaster is a feature rich braille translator software where one can work on multiple documents in different tabs at a time.
- The main window provide access to the Table of Content, Text Writer, and Braille Translation.
- Text Writer allows to type text on the keyboard and right section displays the braille translation of entered text content.
- Table of content simply shows the style of text in line by line manner and one can format
 entered text as blocked text, body text, centered text, displayed 3-5, heading, caption, etc.
- Allows content as a list, poetry, index, numeric, notes, play, etc.
- Permits to insert table and edit its properties, Transcriber generated pages, image placeholder, image describer, etc.
- · It provides a Maths Editor to insert mathematical formulas.
- Can add typographical emphasis (bold, italic, underline, strike through) to text and convert
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- It lets to type in the Six-key mode, and get the respective braille symbols to insert to the current document and can change translation to 'direct' or 'uncontracted'.
- It provides a separate Braille Preview window too.
- Can customize Braille Standard (UEB, EBAE, Spanish, etc.), Page Properties, and Page Numbers.
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- It also allow to split or merge files to get desired output and easy access to most of its features, it provides a tools panel on its interface.

The advisory board shall monitor and review the efficacy of the policy on annual basis.





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


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
