The Vice-President, A.Shama Rao Foundation, Mangalore has applied for renewal of the Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate for starting the BDS Course with an intake of 100 seats afresh from the academic year 2012-13 at Srinivasa Institute of Dental Sciences, Mangalore vide reference at (1) above.

The Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences has consented to grant affiliation for BDS Course with an intake of 100 seats in the said institution for the academic year 2012-13 subject to approval from Syndicate of RGUHS, DCI/GOI, New Delhi vide reference at (2) above.

Government of Karnataka have considered the consent of affiliation granted by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences and decided to renew the Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate for starting the BDS course with an intake of 100 seats afresh in this institution from the academic year 2012-13 subject to the condition that the institution shall give an undertaking in the form of a MOU to the effect that the percentage of seats that will be determined from time to time shall be surrendered to Government of Karnataka quota as per consensual agreement that will be entered into from time to time.

Therefore, as per Section 10 A of the Dentists' Act, 1948 read with Regulation 6 (4) of the Dental Council of India (Establishment of New Dental Colleges, opening of new or higher course of study or Training and increase of admissions capacity in Dental Colleges) Regulations 2006, the Government of Karnataka hereby grants and renewal of the Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate to Srinivasa Institute of Dental Sciences, Mangalore for starting the BDS course with an intake of 100 seats afresh from the academic year 2012-13 in the prescribed format as below:
